The library was open **2,201** hours in 2021



5,275 people have a card at our library



37,894 people walked through our doors last year



In addition to **23,973** website visits



2,893 new items were added last year



Bringing the total collection to **21,552**



There were **23,693** downloads of e-Content



Including training classes, eAudio, eBooks, films & music



Community members borrowed **85,155** physical items



Contributing to a total of **108,848** checkouts



That is **24.6%** higher than 2020!

Even with the building closed for 4.5 months, program participation rose by **2.4%**







The library has **9** public computers

Patrons used them for **3,029** sessions

They also connected **56,963** times to our Wi-Fi!

We lent our items to libraries outside of our system **24,880** times

And brought in **37,241** items upon patron request





In response to students, families, and individuals needing stable at-home Internet for online learning and connection, 4 Telus smart hubs (with data) and 2 Chromebooks were added to the Gadgets to Go collection.

Further supporting learning, the library offered tutoring, the 1,000 Books before Kindergarten program, and peer reading support.
